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Case Study: Detroit Community Schools Overview

Background

•Detroit Community Schools (DCS) is a low income (Title I), urban charter school located in Northwest Detroit.

•EBLI trained the entire K-12 staff of 68 teachers at Detroit Community Schools in fall/winter of 2011. Teachers immediately implemented EBLI instruction in the classroom after being trained.

About the Study

•Each teacher provided EBLI instruction in their classrooms throughout the school year with varying degrees of implementation and fidelity.

•DCS used Michigan Literacy Progress Profile (MLPP) testing for Kindergarten (21 students).

•For 2nd – 10th grades, DCS used the Scantron Performance Series diagnostic assessment in Reading and Math (655 students). Both assessments were administered 3 times throughout the year to measure student progress.




Michigan Literacy Progress Profile (MLPP): Kindergarten Results






