Case Study: East Jordan Middle School

Overview

Background

- •EBLI trained every educator at East Jordan Middle School from 6th through 8th grades.
- •Teachers were trained over the summer so they were able to implement EBLI in fall of the 2006 school year.
- •East Jordan Middle School teachers provided EBLI instruction in whole-class settings.
- •East Jordan Middle School used the Michigan Educational Assessment Program (MEAP) scores to assess student progress and the effectiveness of EBLI instruction.

About the Study

- •Each teacher provided EBLI instruction in a school wide reading class from the beginning of September through mid-October, which is when the MEAP test is administered.
- •East Jordan Middle School compared school-wide MEAP scores in 2005 (no EBLI instruction) to 2006 MEAP scores (with EBLI instruction).


•Students received EBLI instruction in their 20 minute reading class every day for 5 weeks prior to MEAP testing.



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MEAP Results

MEAP Scores - 6th through 8th Grades % of Proficient Students



With EBLI Instruction... Percentage increase of students demonstrating proficiency: 6th Grade: +27% 7th Grade: +12% 8th Grade: +8%
